Day 1 – Sunday, September 15

We meet in the lobby of the **Antony Hotel** near the **Venice** airport and depart for **Piran, Slovenia**, a lovely town on the sparkling **Adriatic Sea**. After exploration and lunch, we continue toward **Rovinj**, one of Croatia’s most picturesque towns. There will be time to walk the stairstep streets, peer in the shops and admire the stone architecture before **DINNER. OVERNIGHT – ROVINJ**

Day 2 – Monday, September 16

This morning, after an orientation to the **Dalmatian Coast and Croatia**, we explore charming **Rovinj**, one of Croatia’s most beautiful seaside towns. It’s built on a tiny peninsula – formerly an island – and boasts lively cafés, stairstep streets, artist studios and some of the best ice cream on the **Adriatic**. Take a boat ride to a nearby island; explore the **Cathedral of St. Eufemija**, with its campanile inspired by the tower in **Venice’s Piazza San Marco**; and admire the compact old town from its seaside promenade. **OVERNIGHT – ROVINJ**

Day 3 – Tuesday, September 17

Rovinj lies on the shore of the **Istrian Peninsula**. Just inland are a clutch of medieval hill towns, including enchanting **Motovun**. After a visit here, and a special **LUNCH** in an *agroturizm* (farmhouse restaurant) hidden in the hills, we

move on to **Poreč**, a lively coastal town and the home of the **Basilica of St. Euphrasius**, boasting glorious **Byzantine**-era mosaics. Back in **Rovinj**, we enjoy free time. **OVERNIGHT – ROVINJ**

Day 4 – Wednesday, September 18

This morning we make our last **Istrian Peninsula** visit, to the spectacularly preserved Roman arena in **Pula**. Then we leave the coast and enter the limestone-clad uplands called the *karst*. Our destination: **Plitvička Jazera**, adjacent to Croatia’s most renowned national park, the **UNESCO-listed Plitvička Lakes National Park**. At day’s end we check into our comfortable hotel on the edge of the park and have **DINNER. OVERNIGHT – PLITVIČKA**

Day 5 – Thursday, September 19

We spend all day visiting the remarkable **Plitvička Lakes National Park** – 16 lovely lakes in a mountain valley, each joined to the next by plunging waterfalls. On foot across sturdy boardwalks and by boat we get to know this gorgeous part of Croatia. Late in the day we return to our hotel where, after a break, we enjoy **DINNER. OVERNIGHT – PLITVIČKA**

Day 6 – Friday, September 20

From **Plitvička** today we return to the coast road and thus arrive in lively **Šibenik**, home of the world-class **Cathedral of St. Jakov**, with its rich collection of Gothic sculptures. Next is one of

Croatia's most spectacular national parks, **Krka**, a riot of flowing water and cascades as the **Krka River** rushes out of the limestone *karst* on its way to the **Adriatic**. At day's end we arrive in **Trogir**, set on a tiny island. You will love strolling its intimate, pedestrian-friendly streets paved with glowing marble. **OVERNIGHT – TROGIR**

Day 7 – Saturday, September 21

From **Trogir** we travel by boat or bus to the handsome port of **Split**, Croatia's second-largest city. Here we take a guided tour of the palace of the **Roman Emperor Diocletian**, built in the 300s. Today it's an amazing combination of churches, shops, marble-clad streets and tenements dating back to the Middle Ages. Later, after **LUNCH** at an authentic Croatian *kanoba* (restaurant specializing in typical cuisine), we return to pretty Trogir. **OVERNIGHT – TROGIR**

Day 8 – Sunday, September 22

Today is our chance to get to know amazing **Trogir**. We will visit the beautiful **Cathedral of St. Laurence**, with its elaborately carved west portal and the sumptuously decorated burial chapel of **John of Trogir**. Around noon we make the short drive to the coastal area known as the **Kaštela**, where nobles in the 1400s built fortified mansions that resemble castles. **LUNCH** in **Kaštela**. **OVERNIGHT – TROGIR**

Day 9 – Monday, September 23

From **Trogir** we travel today along a spectacular coastal road, drinking in the scenery – arid uplands, rugged mountains and the blue **Adriatic**. Our first stop: ancient **Mostar** in the neighboring nation of **Bosnia-Herzegovina**. In Mostar, Christians and Muslims lived in peace for centuries until the upheavals of the 1992-94 **Bosnian War**. Late in the day we come to **Dubrovnik**, the “pearl of the **Adriatic**.” Here, the most centrally located and convenient accommodations are private apartments. You will appreciate being at the very edge of this magical walled city. **OVERNIGHT – DUBROVNIK**

Day 10 – Tuesday, September 24

We spend today savoring beautiful **Dubrovnik**. There will be time to walk the city ramparts, which encompass one of the most complete ensembles of renaissance and Gothic buildings in Europe. The **Rector's Palace** with its **City Museum** is a must, and two old monasteries – **Dominican** and **Franciscan** – are worth a visit. You will enjoy our **DINNER** at the upscale bistro **Horizont**, where chef Dino Jovanoski spe-

cializes in farm-to-table dining, inspired by seasonal produce and the best local suppliers. **OVERNIGHT – DUBROVNIK**

Day 11 – Wednesday, September 24

One of the most spectacular sights in this area is the deep **Gulf of Kotor**, south of **Dubrovnik** in the neighboring nation of **Montenegro**. We make a day trip to its lovely shores and to **Kotor**, its old town a warren of alleyways, squares and city walls. Enjoy lunch in the old town. On our return, we stop in picturesque **Perast**, on the dramatic shores of the gulf. **OVERNIGHT – DUBROVNIK**

Day 12 – Thursday, September 26

We make the most of our last day in **Dubrovnik**. In the morning, take free time for last-minute sightseeing or shopping. Around noon, we travel by ferry to the old Croatian town of **Cavtat**, founded by the **Greeks**. After a **FAREWELL LUNCH** in this idyllic seaside setting, return to Dubrovnik or take another ferry to the unspoiled island of **Lokrum** just offshore. **OVERNIGHT – DUBROVNIK**

Getaway Day – Friday, September 27

After breakfast today we fly home from the **Dubrovnik** airport.
